### A Note From **Your Vicar**

When you take on the leadership of a church you inherit many things. Some of them expected and some of them less expected. I don't even have a landline, which means nobody can call me about PPI or call to ask whether I've had an accident. But one of my predecessors had 5 separate landlines installed and has left the entrails wrapped throughout the house. You also get to see the horticultural passions of your predecessors. James left me a chicken wire fence and others have left tropical plants, two plum trees, a voracious walnut tree that is annually raided by squirrels and a fig tree.

It feels wrong to anthropomorphise a plant but I'm going to anyway. This fig tree is 'haughty'...It has massive growing tendrils all over the place and an actual second trunk that started as a root but got ambitious and sought for the skies. But this year the tree rebounded with prideful fury, doubling in height and shooting out a third 'head'. But no fruit.

Those of you who know your bible will remember the story of the fig tree that produces no figs...chop it down say the servants make it useful....one more year replies Jesus, perhaps it will yet bear fruit and at least in my head, I had already booked my Dad in with his chainsaw until vesterday I noticed strange blobs on the tree.

September....September! And Fruits are arriving. We may actually see some edible fruit from this tree. I suppose the lesson, if any, is that you don't know when the real fruit is going to arrive. Life is surprising, God is surprising and if you jump in too quickly with the chainsaw you might cut off the chances of surprises yet growing up.


Only trouble is I don't even like figs.

# FOR CREATIONTIDE WE'RE SUPPORTING PRACTICAL ACTION







"CREATIONTIDE" is the period in the annual church calendar, in September, which is dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life. The theme for this year is "Let Justice and Peace Flow". The prophet Amos cries out 'Let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never failing stream '. Amos 5.24.

We all know that the way we are treating the Earth is not as God intends - and that we are destroying the delicate balance of nature.. The urgency grows and we must make visible peace with the Earth and on the Earth, at the same time that justice calls us to repentance and a change of attitude and actions, and so we are called to join with that river of justice and peace, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity - and to care more for the Earth and it's people.

Therefore, for this year's 'Creationtide' we shall be making our retiring collections for "Practical Action" - a UK registered development charity dedicated to a world that works better for everyone, by supporting communities to develop ingenious, lasting and locally-owned low tech solutions for agriculture, water and waste management, climate resilience and clean energy. Then to share what works best with others so that many more people can work with and for their environment and conserve the natural resources that so many communities rely on - and which are increasingly under threat.
