- 2. Explosive charismatic worship in a circus tent.



Why should I choose between charismatic and contemplative expressions of prayer when they are both essentially the same thing? Why can't a charismatic enjoy being quiet (He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." Ps. 46:10)?

Why can't a contemplative shout for joy to the Lord (Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs Ps. 100:1)?

Why can't these be complimentary expressions within the diversity of the Body of Christ, both in the likeness of Christ, all for the glory of Christ?

Well, I believe we really acheived a time of real togetherness. An acceptance that our two Sunday Services having different approaches yet coming together, each service compromising and accepting the differences. It was a real moment. It was an actual moment of of our expressions joining together as the Body of Christ for His glory. What a moment St Georges....ready to do it again on the 2nd July??

THE VALLEY CAFE


The Valley Café is meeting again this **Thursday at 2.30pm in our Dunning Room.**





CHARITY COLLECTION at St G's

Our Charity Collection for the month of June is



This Sunday is "Environment Sunday" and so, this week and for the month of June our retiring collections will be donated to 'A Rocha UK' which is a Christian charity working to equip Christians and churches to protect and restore the environment - for God, nature and all people. They aim to: inspire individuals and families, equip churches and church leaders, build partnerships and manage land for nature and people. In the face of accelerating climate change and species loss, we need more than ever to take action to protect and care for nature today.

More Christians than ever are recognising creation care as an integral part of Christian mission. The 'Wild Christian' programme is a community of individuals and families enjoying and learning about nature together, taking practical action in homes and communities, and joining their voices for national impact. Join the journey to live more joyfully and sustainably with God's creation.

A Rocha administer 'Eco Church' which is a learning community of churches of all shapes and sizes open to all denominations. It is an on-line framework to support and inspire churches and their leadership to take practical action on caring for God's earth.

They also manage some land for nature and people. Wolf Fields is an urban community nature reserve on the outskirts of London - once an abandoned area used for drug dealing and fly tipping, it now provides local people, churches and community groups with access to green space. The reserve includes an orchard, community allotment, bee hives, sensory garden, prayer labyrinth, ponds and a story-telling area for children and much more - which is used by schools, youth and community groups.

They are, also working on another Nature Reserve, dedicated to providing a wetland habitat, in an area of rural land on the border between Suffolk and Essex which was left to them by a dedicated supporter. This reserve supplies essential research and conservation opportunities, as well as a place of peace and beauty for local people and visitors alike.

If you are interested to know more, please pick up some information which will be in Church this Sunday, to see how you could be involved.


