A Note From Administrator Your Vizal

With Nick being off it falls upon me to write the opening article for this week's NewsBoard. I had started writing a very different NewsBoard this week but then my week changed so I started again and then what I wrote just didn't quite feel right so I am feeling strangely called to go back to what I was writing so I do hope you do not mind me sharing in this way.

I was thinking about 'Advance Words' or a bible verse that you feel God is drawing your attention to for the year ahead. We have been looking at this at Home Group and I shared that I never really feel God "speaking" to me like that. Is it because I dont pray enough, read my bible enough, am too busy running around here and there to stop and listen. My days are constantly in conversation with God but actually being still with Him? It's not something I am very good at if I am being honest.

Since we were looking at this and sharing this in Home group, I had been drawn to the bible verse from Matthew 11 - "Come to me all you who are weary..." I said I didnt know whether that was because I really am tired so my brain took me to that passage but that I would keep going back, praying and just see.

I think where I have been going wrong is to think I am not hearing God because I don't actually hear His voice saying those words, but I AM hearing Him as He's been making that verse VERY clear to me since.

I listened to a podcast which began with that passage 2 days later. I was having a conversation with someone 2 days after that when that passage came up and then yesterday I was trying to find some comfort in the fact that we can have good days and bad days (my week this week is filled with extremes of losing my dear dog Missy to going to an exciting ABBA concert in London with my sister and nieces) and the verse that came up on good old Google was - yep, "Come to me all you who are weary..." and the title "Run to Jesus and rest in Him"

So I am going to sit with that for a while longer. I do feel as though I am being called to just rest and sit with Him for a while. And to make space to do that amongst all the busyness to do so, that's now going to be the important bit.

Reading The Message version of that passage made me smile, especially the beginning part where it says "Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest." I've got to come to Him first. To seek Him to sit with Him.

Do any of you feel as though He is calling you to a particular passage or He gives you a word to reflect on and hold onto for a season?

I'm sure this passage of mine here will be one for many of us, not just me with all you are carrying on your shoulders. As one of my lovely Home Group said "There is never a bad time to hear and sit with that passage" so even if this is just the passage for me for now and for this time, I'm take that and go with it. And I'll let you know how I get on with being still.....

 Pet food - dry and tinned.



CHARITIES at St G's

OUR CHARITY COLLECTION IS FOR TURKEY-SYRIA EARTHQUAKE APPEAL VIA SAVE THE CHILDREN

It has been decided that our collections this week will be given to the Special Appeal for the victims of the Earthquake in Turkey and Syria through Save the Children as this need is very urgent. Save the Children have been working in this region for many years so have well-established relationships with local organisations and are able to move quickly. Emergency Response Teams are already working with Turkish and Syrian partners to provide what children need most - the provision of a SAFE warm place to be, with care, food, medical help earthquakes.



Large numbers of children will have lost their homes and families and need immediate help and protection in this first period of national confusion when they are at the greatest risk of danger and exploitation, and they need a safe place to stay. Immediate needs will be met where these centres are set up and will continue in the following weeks and months as massive efforts will need to be made to try and trace any surviving family members and care will be needed over a length of time.

The massive disruption following these catastrophic events require special provision to be made for children who find themselves alone - and for any surviving family members - ensuring shelter from the bitter cold, food, clean water and hygiene kits. Our support will enable as many children and families to be helped as is humanly possible.

If you are new to us at St George's, instead of having a collection plate for the Church, we chose charities each week that we collect for and donate to. If you would like to donate to tese charities, do bring your money to the Sunday

Service and pop into the donations basket.

Somerset County Council Update February 2023

- An expert team from the Local Government Association (LGA) has commended work to create a new unitary council on 1 April this year. The team reviewed the unitary plan and concluded that 'everything is in place to ensure that Somerset Council will be a safe and legally functioning body from day 1, assuming the current progress and leadership is maintained. The reviewers were impressed by the hard work and collaboration of people across the five existing councils.
- A bold new recruitment campaign has launched in Somerset. The 'My Time to Care' campaign was shot entirely in Somerset and stars local carers in six new videos. The campaign aims to empower carers and show how working in social care in Somerset is a respected, meaningful, and fun career choice.

 The Council has simplified the application process too. Anyone who is interested just has to visit www.proudtocaresomerset. co.uk and leave their details, and the team will get in contact with potential suitable roles.
- A range of new services and partnerships have been introduced to build on the welcoming, safe spaces library buildings represent. These new services include a wider range of loanable resources (including ipads/thermal cameras/ blood pressure monitors/activity tracker watches). The Activity Tracker Watch loaning scheme means members of the library (16 and over) can borrow a device for up to six weeks free of charge. If you're new to exercise or want to move more, gauge your progress, and live near Taunton you can borrow one giving you a chance to see whether having an Activity Tracker Watch is something you'd like to consider investing in.
- Somerset residents are being invited to have their say on the new Somerset Council's approach to planning matters.

(SCI) – a single approach
to planning which will be

- Could you help get people to crucial medical appointments? Volunteer drivers are needed urgently across Somerset. People across Somerset with no transport of their own need help to get to important medical appointments. It is an ideal opportunity for anybody over 18 with a full UK driving licence and four-door car to do something for their community. For each journey carried out by a volunteer driver, a mileage reimbursement rate of 45p per mile or 50p per mile loaded is applied.
