# A Note From Your Vicar

You get what you pay for.

There are so many areas in life that it is both impossible to be an expert in every single one and obviously people are trying to make profit. A good example is the now defunct shop Maplin. It ran a good trade selling cables and accessories for all of the tech needs of our age. But it would also bamboozle people too. You could buy a 'gold plated HMDI' cable (one that goes between the telly and computer/DVD player/games console) and it would be the 'best possible picture'. The reality is that any difference is virtually imperceptible by human beings but a company is more than willing to charge you £100 for a £5 cable.

This is especially difficult with advice. In an internet age it's easy to think of ourselves as experts and the advent of social media has made everyone feel they have a voice. How do you know if advice is good or bad? Our Peter Joyce often says in committee meetings that if we have paid for advice, we ought to heed it, rather than overriding it via groupthink. I had an experience of 'you get what you pay for' this week as our smaller dog is quite poorly with her back. ## **OUR PRAYER SHED**

The Day of Prayer was a brilliant start for our Prayer Shed. The day was divided into 12 slots and continuous prayer and worship was held across the day. Different leaders helped to host all of the slots across a variety of styles and topics. There was testimony, group prayers, silent prayers, communion, louder worship music and a lovely section for children and young people. I was so blessed as we welcomed people from the wider community into the prayers. There is a lovely passage in Isaiah, that says:

'My Temple will be called a house of prayer for the people of all nations.

Prayer brings people together in a intimate and creative way in a manner that even services cannot quite match. One aspect I was particularly struck by the desire for silence and quiet in the space. 'There is so much to reflect on' was the comment of one attendant.

I personally want to say a big thank you to Karen Williams and Jane H who organised so much of the day and out real effort into making it a venue that's attractive and peaceful. It has had quite a transformation from junk shed and is now filled with activities to help you in your prayer life.

#### What now?

The Prayer Shed is ready and waiting for you. It's open 24/7. Sometimes it'll be used for groups, so the youth@II will meet there. It is bookable, if you want to reserve a space but it's also intentionally left free so that people can access it to take stock, pray and relax. My dream is that it will be a refuge for people who are struggling and just need a sanctuary. Jane Hamilton is taking charge of the space going forward and you'll hear more from her in time.




