There are lots of difficult things happening in the world. The situation between Israel/Palestine is terrible, the war in Ukraine grinds down the people of the land and beyond and whilst in past times we would not have heard of events in such different places the reverberations are found in our media and our current financial situation. One trend I've noticed within certain circles (especially on the internet) is the desire to speak in an expert manner about topics which they are, at least, only partially informed. So two years ago, many people became experts on vaccines and microbiology, last year there were many opinions on Easter Europe and the identity of NATO and now the furiously complicated situation in that tiny little strip of land between Asia, Europe and Africa is now attracting enormous 'expert' comment. I try not to write about too many political things or world events in these notes to the church and community. That's not because I don't think they're important, it's not because I don't have an opinion (ask me and I'll tell you), instead, I am aware of my own lack of knowledge in so many areas. I seem to know much less about the world the more I understand it or 'the more I know, the more I know I don't know'.

The second reason I tend not to write about these wider matters is that I have little to no control over those

situations. We pray for those difficult situations and indeed will continue to pray for 'the peace of Jerusalem' as the scriptures tell us to do. But prayer is giving our concerns, questions and being over to God, not a list of instructions for a powerful but foolish leader who needs us to tell him what to do.

So what can we do? You can pray. You can read. You can exercise the humility of saying, this is horrible but I don't know what the answers are. And then you can hug the ones close to you and work in the time and space God has given you to bring the light and goodness demonstrated by Jesus in the here and now. That's why we're building fridges and soup sessions and toddler groups and loneliness cafes and bereavement support and prayer spaces and buggy walks and other stuff I've forgotten, because we believe that the light has shone in the darkness and that the darkness has not overcome it. There is good news, there is hope and we can make a difference in this time and space even as global events seem bleak.
