A Note From **YOUR VICAR**

Last week I took my little one to the slide but there was one big obstacle; the rope ladder. 'Help me' was the request. 'Nope, you can do it' was my response. I didn't want to quite lift her to the top but instead offer gradual steps of advice; arms first, then move that leg on there; you can do it, you can do it....I'm standing nearby to catch her in case of disaster but the sense of achievement when 'I've done it myself' is enormous. Positive experience built confidence, which was reinforced again and again until I got cold and decided it was time to go home!

It's not that I expect my little one to be a gymnast or professional climber. I just want her to be confident to move and do the things she wants to do. I don't want her to be afraid of what she can do.

When I trained to be a vicar, I spent a lot of time reading books which at the end gave me a piece of paper with some fancy lettering on it and then I had a training curacy where I learnt how to do stuff practically. Theory and practice lived in two different spaces. Before I came to work for St Georges, I used to work for another college called St Mellitus which intentionally tried to mix up the practical training with the theological and academic work. This caused some nice combinations with students using stuff in the week, they'd just learnt in the classroom.

This 24th February we're starting 'Monday Night Ministry' or MNM. We're beginning a course looking at our calling, how we do theology at all and some biblical background. Like the playground, it's not that you want to be a professional minister (unless you do)

but instead you don't know what you can do until you try. The word 'minister' is a way of saying 'service', so when someone says 'I am a minister', it doesn't really mean 'I own a dog collar and have a theological qualification' but that I serve God with what I've got. Coming on this course doesn't mean you're going to get a dog collar (they come free with the shirts...) but that you want to have a think about the gifts God has given you and think about how they might be used.

Like the little one on the rope ladder; I don't want you to be frightened by what you can already do and then when you get to the top... you'll probably say, what else can I do? It's only six weeks long. I'd like a small group and about half of the places have gone already. Email me at nick@stgchurch.co.uk if you want to be part of it.

CHARITY COLLECTION


For the month of February we will be supporting our Bursary Fund so that we can support any of our Church Family who needs a helping hand.
