A Note From YOUR VICAR

Last weekend I took a trip to London and climbed to the top of Garden at 120. This is the free version of the 'Skygarden' and can be found on Fenchurch Street. Arriving at the place is a reminder of how far development in London has moved on compared to much of the country. The buildings are very futuristic and surrounded by mirror-glassed skyscrapers. The queue was reasonable and guests were entertained by the strange and huge moving screen that was on the ceiling showing - I don't quite know how to describe them - moving amorphous shapes that look a bit like pondwater underneath a microscope.

At 15 stories height I was glad of the elevator and the view is impressive. The iconic swerve of the Thames, St Pauls in the distance, with the London Eye peeking around the corner. London is an old city. Really old, with claims on Bronze Age bridges and perhaps wooden structures reaching back into 4500 BC. That's old old. It's the sort of place you trip over history. Oh look! There's the tower of London! Oh look that's the oldest church in London -650 ish – replete with Roman pavement preserved in it's underground tunnels (free to enter!). When you look over the skyline this mix of history and present reality is obvious. As you look down from the rooftop of the garden, there was an excavation of an old church tower reflected in the aleaming glass of the towers. Medievalism and Modern concrete cheek by jowl.

"No man ever steps in the same river twice. For it's not the same river and he's not the same man." So said Heraclitus – a pre-socratic Greek philosopher. Change is constant. This is obvious when old and new are so close. I ask this question all of the time about our own church community. This building is here now and it is the church, but it has not always been. The old stones make it seem like it's all been there forever and ever but it was substantially rebuilt in 1800s. The church community now is here but has not always been here. Some people love to remind me, 'we've done this before' when we start something new. This is true and not true; you can't stand in the same river twice. Some of our current activities rhyme with previous versions; 'Soup' with 'Soup Saturdays' or 'Men's Shed' with the 'Stewards' but they aren't the same thing because they are different people.

All of this change can make people feel quite anxious because you can feel like you're on a roundabout you want to get off from. Even death changes us individually and in the memory; so stillness is an illusion for humans and the only one who does not change is God. He is the rock of ages, faithful in life and death. So whilst this mortal coil spins and shifts, he does not. By accepting the reality of the situation, you accept that you are not God which really is quite a lot off from your shoulders
