A Sudden Silence -But Not the End

It came without warning. One click of a button, and five years of work disappeared. Our church YouTube channel – which had grown from a lifeline in lockdown into a thriving community of worship and encouragement – has been terminated. No explanation. No appeal. Just gone.

This hurt. Alot. It might not mean much to you if you have never used it but for some, this is their way to be able to worship God. When people have been poorly, they have not missed out. When people have been away they have still been able to connect. And for me, it's been 5 years worth of alot of hard work. Since the start of Covid, that little channel was more than just a collection of videos. It was connection. When our church doors had to close, it was a way to gather, to keep "the flock" together, and to remind each other: we are not alone.

I still remember those first shaky videos filmed in my kitchen – introducing songs, sharing smiles, offering hope. Trying to teach myself how to edit videos that looked good enough for people to want to join in with. Then, as God so often provides, help arrived in the form of Rev. Martin Kirkbride, who had just moved to the area (a story in itself of God's timing and calling!). With his support, we began recording real services inside the church. Together with the faithful contributions of Geoff Treasure preaching from his study, and others like Peter Joyce praying out on the Blackdown Hills, a patchwork of worship began to emerge.

As time went on, and with the arrival of a new vicar bringing fresh energy and ideas and a "Let's give it a go" attitude, our online presence blossomed. He filmed in an empty church, spoke to faces he had never even seen or met, and little by little our online community grew.

We now had nearly 500 people subscribed, many finding comfort, encouragement, and faith through those Sunday services.

And now – all gone. At least on YouTube.

But here's the truth we need to hold on to: God's Word is never silenced. Isaiah 40:8 reminds us, "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever." Platforms may come and go. Videos may vanish. But what was shared, what was sown, and what was received in people's hearts cannot be deleted.

Yes, this actually, for me, hurts. But it is not the end of the story. Just as Paul was thrown into prison yet kept writing letters that still encourage us today, so too can we find new ways to share the Good News. Our task remains the same: to be light in the darkness, to encourage one another, and to keep going.

The channel may be gone, but the community is not. The hope is not. The faith is not. And God most certainly is not.

Let us press on, for the message we carry is greater than any platform.

"Go into all the world and preach the good news to all – In my name you will place your hands on sick people and they will get well". Prayer Ministry is for all people, Christians and non Christians alike.

Jesus also tells us, His followers that He gives us power and authority to minister to others, to cure diseases, and to heal the sick (in mind, body or spirit) Luke 9.1-2. Throughout the Gospels we find accounts of Jesus healing all kinds of disease, paralysis, seizures, severe pain, even those affected by demons.



Something beautiful and powerful can happen when we meet to worship opening our hearts and souls and so we want to create that space for people to be able to unashamedly worship the Lord together.



ST GEORGE'S CHARITY COLLECTION



The catastrophic humanitarian crisis in Gaza continues to deteriorate, but donations to the Middle East Humanitarian Appeal are making a difference and helping DEC charities to reach people with lifesaving aid.

The announcement of temporary pauses in the conflict to increase aid deliveries into Gaza provides some long-awaited hope that DEC charities and their local partners can deliver more food, clean water and basic supplies. They are working to use this moment to do whatever they can and reach as many people as possible with support.

The extraordinary challenges around aid delivery have had a devastating impact on their work over the past months. With extremely limited supplies of food, fuel and medicine, they have been unable to carry out some of their lifesaving work. Safe and sustained access for humanitarian aid has never been so urgent.

The humanitarian situation in Gaza is catastrophic. The global hunger monitor, the IPC, has warned that Gaza is now experiencing 'the worst-case scenario of famine'. Reports of people dying from malnutrition and starvation are rising fast. The health system has been decimated, and a dire shortage of fuel means the few hospitals still operating are being forced to make impossible decisions about the treatment they can provide. The remaining supplies of medicine and baby formula have almost gone.

In the past weeks, a surge in mass casualty incidents linked to new aid distribution sites has overwhelmed the shattered healthcare system even further, pushing it past its limit. DEC charities and their local partners are working separately to those distribution sites to deliver the support they are still able to, as safely as they can, such as medical care.

Through everything, staff and their families are dealing with unimaginably harsh conditions and facing significant risks as they carry out their vital work.

How are DEC charities supporting people?

Even in these dire conditions, DEC charities and local partners have still found ways to provide support. They are constantly adapting their operations to deliver whatever aid they can - as they have done throughout the crisis

- supported by generous donations to the Middle East Humanitarian Appeal.

Cash assistance is providing a lifeline as local market prices continue to spiral, enabling families to buy some food and essential items when they become available. Trained medical staff are providing vital care in field hospitals and clinics, even with medicine supplies running critically low.

DEC charities and their local partners have been working hard to continue delivering water, despite shortages of fuel and significant challenges moving around Gaza. Addressing severe shortages of food is the most urgent concern. Although a few DEC charities and their local partners have been distributing some hot meals and food parcels, without supplies entering Gaza, most have been unable to provide the food that so many had been relying on.

Examples of how DEC charities and their local partners have supported people in Gaza over the past weeks include:

ActionAid has been working with its local partner organisation to deliver hot meals through community kitchens.

Concern Worldwide and its local partner have been delivering clean water to displaced families through water trucks.

The British Red Cross is supporting its local partner, the Palestine Red Crescent Society, to provide medical care to some of the many sick and injured.

Oxfam is delivering food parcels to people living in displacement camps.

Donations to the DEC Middle East Humanitarian Appeal are making a difference even in these extraordinarily desperate circumstances. More funds can help to ensure DEC charities and their local partners are ready to scale up their response when an opportunity arises.
