## A Note From **Your Vicar**

St GEORGE'S

Last week I applied for (another) grant. 10,000 for something exciting. I needed to take a photograph of something boring to get something exciting. The boring thing is in a full cupboard behind plenty of stuff and I needed to get various angles using my fairly basic phone. Some of you can guess from that description!

As a Vicar, I try to be health and safety conscious – mostly because I can't sue myself here – and gradually unloaded the cupboard. After 2 minutes I got bored and decided to lean over an obstacle to get the picture. I got the picture but as I leant over the top my keys fell out of my pocket. It was a bit tight so I found a litter picker and tried to 'pick' my keys off the ground. This failed.

So I leant over again and managed to get the keys. But as I leant over the top my phone slid from inside my pocket, out onto the floor where my keys had been. I leant over picked up the phone which was not damaged by the fall.

I repacked the cupboard, slightly smug that I'd managed to get the photo which might secure 10k for our little church. It was only as I grabbed my keys that I realised they'd broken in the fall and that my car key remained on the floor of the cupboard.

And at this point I just laughed. All on my own I laughed in a way that made someone come and see if I was ok. Not a bad laugh. Just laughing at myself. At the beginning I'd tried to save some time and energy by not removing the items from the cupboard. But in the process, I used triple the time and energy. This shortcut wasn't so short. It was much longer.

The Psalmist writes;

"Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him... Refrain from anger and turn from wrath; do not fret—
it leads only to evil."

Waiting does not need to be a passive process. It actually takes energy to wait well, to be patient and go a little slower than you first think. Indeed, if I had not 'fretted' but been patient I would've been alright rather than dangle perilously over the top of a trolley to retrieve my keys. Jesus asks, what do you add to your life by worrying. Perhaps we might add rushing...

\*All volunteers must complete St George's Safeguarding training and be DBS checked by our Safeguarding Officer prior to helping.




### CHRISTMAS WREATH WORKSHOP DON'T MISS OUT ON THIS FESTIVE EVENT


In this run-up to Christmas they are encouraging the world to "shine a light for peace" and ask us "this Christmas, how will you shine a light for peace?"
