## **Your Vicar**

The Law of Bicycle Sheds.

It's easier to get a nuclear reactor approved than a bike shed. I have no idea how a nuclear reactor works – something to do with rods in water producing steam and turbines and then afterwards clearing up is a bit tricky – but beyond that I haven't got the foggiest idea. And nor do most people, including those who often have some kind of approval or responsibility for these things. Whereas a bike shed... well the REAL question is what colour should it be!

This argument is taken from Parkinson's law of triviality which states that argument that people within an organization commonly or typically give disproportionate weight to trivial issues that are minor but easily graspable, whereas complex but important topics get little weight and therefore time. If you've ever worked in an office and had to deal with the guardians of a stationery cupboard or a mess officer in the military or dare I say it, BT, then I think you know what I'm talking about.

The church is not immune to this problem. I vividly remember Norman telling me of a PCC meeting which sailed through important questions of mission and worship and spent 2 hours discussing the grass cutting!

In the gospels, Jesus always cuts through the nonsense.

Whenever someone tries to give him a rubbish excuse or blag then he cuts through.

Take the woman at the well in John 4 who tries to talk about the proper location for the Temple, nope says Jesus – let's talk about God not geography. Or the disciple terrified of running out of food for the gathered, nope says Jesus, you find them something to eat.

Sometimes I wonder if as a vicar I spoke more like Jesus, I'd get kicked out of the Church of England....
Steve Jobs said that the key to achievement is focus. And focus is achieved not by saying 'yes' but by staying 'no'. Keeping the main thing, the main thing.

The vision for St Georges is to grow in spirit. That means our main focus as a community is to get to know God better through worship, through prayer, study and time together. The second is to grow in number and this means we want to reach out and keep on reaching out and this is where our multitude of different outreach projects come in. We want to be more and more of a blessing to this community.

As this growing broadsheet testifies we are doing more. Annnnnnd more is on the way. But the question for any of these initiatives is how do they help us i) grow in spirit ii) grow in number.

## **BUILDING PROJECTS - PHASE ONE - THE PARISH OFFICE**

Last Sunday, Paul Cole introduced the first phase of our building project that will enable us to grow in spirit and in number.

Phase one focusses on improving the functions of the office by making it more physically accessible and shifting the entrance to make a lobby area. Our exciting journey of growth in the last year has revealed how important communication is to the life of the church. The office is a central part of that work and keeps the whole ministry of St George's working. Our staff team has grown with a worship director alongside our administrator and the arrival of our new curate Rob Cromwell (only 3 months away!) means that we need to make this space work efficiently.

The current layout is dangerous to access, impossible for anything with wheels and means that Bethan is frequently interrupted throughout the day.

This project is called phase one because we anticipate renewing sections of our hall and church buildings to help them reflect our growing and active community of faith latterly. But this initial project helps us build for growth, as we increase staffing capacity to facilitate and care for the anticipated growth.


As Chris said to us last week, we've doubled in a year...who knows where we'll be in another year!



# Our Charity Collection is for AWAY FROM IT ALL - MOTHERS' UNION

Many people think of Mothers' Union as being a group of 'old ladies' of the church having tea! Nothing could be further from the truth. For well over 100 years this oldest mission society of the Anglican Church has shown "Christian care for families "both overseas and at home.

The "Away from it all " project provides an opportunity for a family, referred by a local church, "whose lives have met with Adversity" and are suffering stress to have a break away together. These opportunities have produced some amazing results.

We read recently, in the Bath and Wells Diocesan Newsletter, of one family who had benefited from this schemed. The father had left the army with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and this was effecting the family badly. Whilst on the holiday, he went to the evening reflection where he heard a passage from Matthew's Gospel: "Come all who are heavily laden and I will give you rest". It was then that he first felt God's presence and, with help, he began to change.



He went back home and started going to Church regularly. This led to him becoming a committed Christian and his whole family have felt the benefit.

Another family have been on an A.F,I.A. break over this last half-term. This is our opportunity to contribute to this work in our Diocese and, maybe, to help some more families to turn their lives around.

Instead of having a collection plate for the Church, we chose charities each week that we collect for and donate to.
We try to donate to local charities,
Christian charities at home and aborad and any Emergency Appeal that is brought to our attention.

- If after praying about it, you would like to change the amount you are already giving to St George's, you will need to fill out a new pledgeform and, if appropriate a new standing order form.





### An SCC Update from Cllr Dawn Johnson

Dear residents,

The budget for the new Somerset Council has been approved. Councillor Liz Leyshon, Deputy Leader and Executive Lead Member for Finance and Human Resources, said: "This has been the most difficult budget setting that any of us can remember. Inflation has been a huge pressure on the cost of providing council services and post-Covid we have seen rises in demand from Somerset residents for very complex support from both Adult Social Care and Children's Services."

The budget confirms an overall rise of 4.99% in the council's share of council tax, made up of a basic rise of 2.99 per cent in council tax and the 2 per cent adult social care levy. The increase is in line with Government policy and councils across the UK that have responsibility for Adult Social Care and Children's Services.

- Councillors have published the priorities for the new Council. The new Council Plan was approved unanimously at a meeting of the outgoing Somerset County Council, whose councillors will form the new Somerset Council on the 1st April 2023. The Somerset Council Plan highlights four key priorities. A further Business Plan, outlining how the Council will deliver services in support of these priorities, will be developed in the coming months. The key priorities for the new Council are:
- A Greener, More Sustainable Somerset
- A Healthy and Caring Somerset
- A Fairer, Ambitious Somerset, and
- A Flourishing and Resilient Somerset

- Figures show that 4,785 secondary school applications were received this year compared to 4,866 in 2022. In total, 92.8% of children received a place at their first preference school, with 98.12% offered one of their top three choices. Parents and carers of children not offered one of their three secondary school preferences have various options available to them. - Gold-hearted community heroes from across Somerset have been recognised at the latest Somerset County Council Chair's Award for Service to the Community. The awards-giving has been an annual event for many years and this year's ceremony at Taunton Rugby Club was attended by 140 people, including 43 nominees from areas right across Somerset. The award recipients were nominated by their parish and town councils for recognition of their outstanding contribution to their communities, and were presented with a signed certificate and gift by the Chair of Somerset County Council, Cllr Mike Best, followed by a buffet reception to celebrate their achievements.
- A one-stop travel information website has been launched by Somerset County Council to support more local people to access public and community transport. If you don't own a car or want to leave it at home and travel more sustainably, Think Travel can help you with your transport options. The new travel planner shows you what's available It covers public transport, community transport, the Slinky demand responsive transport service and car sharing. As well as information on train and bus services, there's also a dedicated car sharing notice board you can sign up to, where offers or requests for car sharing journeys can be posted. The aim is to grow this facility and encourage local car sharing networks to evolve. You can check out "Think Travel" here: https://somerset.thinktravel. info.
- Following the successful Museum of the Moon exhibition in March 2022, it is exciting to hear that Luke Jerram's sister sculpture, "Gaia", will be coming to Taunton Minster in April 2023. The exhibition will be free to see at Taunton Minster between 14 April and 1 May, which encompasses Earth Day on 22 April. A specially made surround sound composition by BAFTA award winning Composer, Dan Jones, will be played alongside the sculpture, as well as a series of Earth and environmental inspired events hosted by the Minster.
