A Note From **Your Vicar**

These last three years have been an extraordinary journey of faith here at St Georges. I arrived in the pandemic. We had to wait in the shed for the movers to put all of our stuff in the house, there was frost on the grass all through the day whilst we huddled around some kind of heater. It was quite a busy day and we watched on our phones as the second lockdown was started including the closure of schools. We've come a long way since then!

In January 2022 we started our new service at 11.00. We started with no regular band musicians, no children's workers or the infrastructure to support it. But God has blessed us in ways we hadn't really expected and more quickly than we expected. If you haven't been along, the 11.00 has swelled with fantastical musicians and some of the best kids work around the area. I am quite often taken aback when I look around and see the sheer quality of my colleagues and friends. God has blessed us richly.

Yet this blessing has brought a challenge because the 11.00 has outgrown it's home. The hall is not big enough to consistently house the congregation safely. Last Sunday there were 110ish people attending the service and this is beginning to veer on the unsafe. Worse it has actually put some people off attending church because they're worried that they can't get a seat, our prayer teams can't hear one another and some just find it too stressful.

Staying in the hall means that we're going to struggle to fulfil our vision of 'growing in spirit and growing in number'.

So after prayer and discussion, we're going to try something out; from 4th February we're moving the 11.00 location to the church building. This is our biggest space, will mean that our tech team have reduced setup times, we'll aim to stream the 9.30 and there is more space made available for coffee and kids work. This is a trial for 3 months to see whether it works. The reasons that we originally chose the hall instead of the church remain pressing challenges – we have no toilets, servery, or breakout spaces in the church itself, the pews are inflexible and some find traditional church buildings a little intimidating. Yet, the PCC agree that we need to make space to continue and not inhibit the good work that has been flourishing here at St Georges.

This is a trial and that means we're going to tweak things along the way which won't be perfect and it means that we're going to compromise a little bit in places to fit everyone in. Compromise is not a dirty word, it's a way of loving our church family and those yet to join it. This is your church, so if there are problems, find a way to communicate constructively and directly to the leadership, don't grumble, that's like kicking yourself in the shin, instead pull together to help this whole community to grow deeper in God and grow in greater number.

There are exciting times ahead. God Bless

CHARITY COLLECTION OPEN DOOR ROOF APPEAL

The Open Door day centre for Taunton's homeless community is housed in a grade 2 listed building that dates back to the 1880s, and the Charity is responsible for the good repair of the building.

A recent building survey has revealed that they need to make major repairs to the roof of the building and need to raise £50,000 to complete the major structural work including structural timbers, chimney repairs and replacement roof membrane.

By the end of November, the total raised for this important campaign has reached £10,000.




