## A Note From **Your Vicar**

Most football clubs around the country have a chaplain. Indeed it is a hard calling to be enlisted as chaplain to your own football team. I live a little way from Manchester United but I think they need all the help they can get...so if you're reading Erik Ten Hag – give me a call. One exception to this rule was Nottingham Forest where the legendary Brian Clough banned chaplains throughout his tenure.

Later, another England legend took over the management – Stuart 'Psycho' Pierce. He was a terrifyingly 'hard man' and in today's football would have been sent off on a weekly basis for his bone crunching tackles. But he did accept the offer of a chaplain. Occasionally, attending training sessions and games, the chaplain managed to ingratiate himself enough to the point where the chaplain was asked for a carol service....Here's how that conversation went: Pierce: 'We want a carol service' Chaplain: 'Yes...of course...er' Pierce: 'What?'

Chaplain: 'Well I am going to talk about Jesus...'

Pierce: (slightly aggressively) 'What? That's what Vicars do isn't it?'.

That little line has stuck with me for years.

There is some stuff that 'Vicars do'. There is some stuff that Christians 'do'. It's part of the deal. And one of the biggest things is prayer. As a Christian community, lots of people have been asking me when our prayer service is and although we hold corporate morning prayer each week on Monday and Thursday and used to do some lunchtime Wednesday sessions, I've been thinking we need something more.

Next Sunday night 3rd March will begin a series of monthly prayer meetings. The desire is to seek God in prayer. Sometimes that'll be guieter, sometimes noisier, we'll pray for our community, for the lost and broken, for our world and lastly ourselves. There will be some worship to help us focus. This is what Christians do. We pray. In my own life, I've found that prayer is both the catalyst and the goal itself. When we pray, stuff happens. But God isn't a vending machine dolling out nice things to those who pay the price, or a teacher giving house points to favourites, instead God is both the means and the goal. We pray because God calls us to, and when we do pray stuff happens. There is so much to pray about for our world in turmoil, the different challenges in our community and prayer for our own lives too.

So join us, next Sunday night at 7.00. It'll be relaxed and prayerful and full of God. Come and Pray. It's what Christians do isn't it?

Each year the Service is written by Christian women from a different country and this year's Service has been written by the women of Palestine.


YOU TOO CAN BE A PART OF THIS GREAT WAVE OF PRAYER !

Their Renew, Refresh, Resource weekends are great and we hope that you will feel all of those


For the month of February we have set up a Fund so that we can support any of our Church Family who needs a helping hand.
