### A Note From Your Vicar

I feel like bananas have been stuffed into my ears.

I mimed this action across a busy pool to my wife on the other side (try miming it to yourself... it's kind of fun) for it seems that swimming seems to equate to temporary (I hope!) deafness these days. Water gets stuck in my ear and I can't hear very much at all. Sometimes there is slight relief and then I do something crazy like go to sleep and I start again. Remedies for this are not very effective. Amongst the tips recommended are: tilt your head on one side, close your mouth and breathe out your nose whilst trapping and releasing air and at the same time not bursting your own eardrums... well figure that out!

This Lent I am giving up social media but I did not intend to give up a whole bodily sense. Deafness is not just a physical aspect but a social one too. Mrs Griffin now tells me that she's not sure if I am simply ignoring her or genuinely can't hear her....to which I simply respond, 'What?'

One of the things that strikes me about a loss of hearing is that it is not simply a physical lack. It is a social isolation where I am unable to communicate effectively with others. Sometimes when I want to switch off this is mildly pleasant, sometimes when I want to have a good conversation it is simply frustrating and reduces confidence because indeed I feel I have bananas in my ears.

I was talking with someone who has hearing problems and works in deaf communities alongside hearing communities and I was fascinated to hear her speak of the 'deaf world'

and the 'hearing world' each having their own community cultures and norms. Amongst those who primarily use their bodies not voices to communicate, sign language can become fluent and beautiful expression of their identity in a similar manner to the way tone and even accents can be used by those with hearing and speech.

One of my favourite stories in the gospel is when Jesus encounters a blind man and asks him simply, 'what do you want me to do for you?' Jesus doesn't presume anything in the question but respects the profound changes that healing will mean for him, a change not only of physical ability but social connection and personal identity. And so back to Lent. We think of it as a time of giving up but what if we rephrase it as Jesus question to us; what do you want me to do for you? Who knows what we will lose or gain in the journey?

Hopefully I'll lose these bananas from my ears. God bless,


# BAPTSIM / CONFIRMATION OPPORTUNITY

This May there is an opportunity to get baptised and/or confirmed with the Bishop of Bath and Wells in St Georges Church.

We'll be hiring a baptismal pool for full immersion baptism and the Bishop and I will be baptising people at the front. Baptism is one of the two sacraments that Protestants recognise and it is a biblical command to 'repent and be baptised', so if you haven't been baptised, please get in touch. You're only supposed to get baptised once! As Ephesians says 'there is one Lord, one Faith and one Baptism', so whether you were pool there is no difference. If you haven't been baptised and you are following the Lord, get in touch and we can get this organised. Lastly on baptism, sometimes people 'reaffirm' their baptismal vows but this is a bit like reaffirming a marriage – it's not new just affirming what's already happened! Talk to me if you're interested or intrigued.

Confirmations are a way of affirming the faith that you hold and maybe if you were baptised as a child, others spoke on your behalf, you now can claim that faith for your own. If you're thinking about ordination then you'll need to get confirmed but it is primarily a way of saying publicly that you belong to this church. place his hands on your head and pray that the Holy Spirit will give you strength and commitment. I was confirmed prior to my ordination and I thought – 'oh it's just a box ticking exercise' – but I was totally blown away by the experience and felt the presence of God most powerfully. Of course, not everyone has that same feeling but it is a public affirmation by the most senior leader in our area of the faith you hold. Talk to me if you want to know more.

There will be a couple of classes together before the service. The classes will be at 7.30 on 27/4 and 4/5 and the confirmation service will take place on 11/5/23 at 7.00pm. Email nick@stgchurch.co.uk to talk or office@stgchurch.co.uk to sign up.



## The Collect Sun 26th Feb First Sunday of Lent


Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ fasted forty days in the wilderness, and was tempted as we are, yet without sin: give us grace to discipline ourselves in

# Our Charity Collection is for TAUNTON TEAM CHAPLAINCY

The purpose of the Taunton Team Chaplaincy is to advance the Christian faith in the town by providing care, witness and prayer in a wide range of community and workplace locations.

Chaplains are drawn from local churches and linked with a workplace or area to visit (usually weekly) with the purpose of offering friendly and supportive care to all. A chaplain's main aim is to listen and take an interest in the people they meet and give comfort and compassion where needed. Time spent with each person varies which may be enough to catch up but, if a longer conversation is needed, arrangements can be made for a chat at a convenient time.

While the Chaplaincy is unashamedly Christian, there is no intention to 'preach' and support is offered to all, those of faith or none. This is an opportunity for us to join with and support the work of the Taunton Team Chaplaincy and help to enable them to continue to show and share the love of God in our town.


