# A Note From **Your Vicar**

This week it's our Carol Services. Care homes, toddlers, Harmony, Tuk-Tuk Carols, Contemporary and Traditional... there are six this week.

Everyone loves a good sing. Even my Dad who never goes to church loves a carol service – clears the pipes out he says. Why do we sing? Feels good, it's beautiful. It can make you feel things. The right song in the right place. But they also bring us together. Following a tragedy certain songs seem to catch the mood right - I've mentioned Oasis' hit 'Don't look back in Anger' following the Manchester Bombings as a good example. But actually Christmas is the biggest example. Mid-November Michael Buble comes out of his cave in the ground, Mariah Carey is defrosted and all the radio stations play different songs for about 25 days. If you play Wham's 'Last Christmas' in March... people become like vampires – eeech - away! These are our songs - now and for this time.

Last week I was at a Castle School Christmas Concert and we all sang Carols. Now Castle has no Christian foundation, it provides no Christian assemblies, it is cautious in it's relationships with Churches around. Christmas time though, 300 people invited to stand and sing: Veiled in Flesh the Godhead see!
Hail the Incarnate Deity!
risen with healing in his wings.
Mild he lays his glory by,
born that man no more may die,
born to raise us from the earth,
born to give us second birth.

This is the Christian gospel. If I said these words aloud in an assembly, that Jesus Christ is God in flesh, born so that us sinners do not have to taste eternal death but receive the healing power, the salvation of Jesus – that you can know that yourself here tonight.... they probably wouldn't ask me back. But put it in a song. Everyone belts it out.

This Christmas I would love to see you at as many Carol Services as you can possibly gobble with as much mulled wine as you can walk home with but what I'd love you to do more is notice the truth behind the lyrics, take a moment and think about the words you're singing. Some of them are nonsense (I'm thinking of you Ding Dong Merrily) but some of them will change your life if you let them go beyond the 25 days per year when they're played on a loop. What's your favourite and why?

# BISHOPS MESSAGE Bishop Michael

When I speak to my Mum on my birthday, she often recalls to me the events that surrounded my arrival in the world. These include nearly being born in the hospital lift, my older brother being smuggled in to see me under my dad's overcoat and of various aunts sneaking onto the maternity ward out of visiting hours by wearing their WRVS uniforms.

Each of us has a unique story about our birth. At Christmas we'll be recounting once again the story that we share about another birth - the birth of Jesus. Across the world we'll be re-telling and re-enacting what happened in Bethlehem more than 2000 years ago. We'll recall the journey of Mary and Joseph, the birth in the stable, the arrival of the shepherds, the song of the angels, the visit of the Magi.

Our own birth stories are unique to each of us. Jesus's is common to us all. And not just because we all know about it. For in our recollection of Jesus' birth, we'll also be remembering that that in him, God came to be at one with us. In Jesus God arrived to share fully in our humanity, experiencing complete solidarity with every aspect of our

human condition. Jesus is 'God with us' – in trenches in Ukraine, bomb shelters in Israel and Gaza, in hospital wards where loved ones die, in relationships where there is conflict and distress.

Just as much as he is with us in our greatest joys and our deepest woes, Jesus is also for us. One of the earliest teachers of the Church said this: 'He became what we are so that we might become what he is.' The baby born in Bethlehem stands with us not only in all that we experience. This child also comes to offer us the possibility of opening every part of our lives to the transforming power of God's life of love and joy and peace. He comes so that every day we can become a little more like him.

This is the good news of Christmas and may it be yours this year.

# **CHARITY COLLECTION** at St G's


