Every now and again I inherit something new from my Nan who died about 5 years ago. It's not that somehow I get given them specifically by her, more that my Dad does not want the stuff in the house anymore and I'm the only one with a house to put them in. He once arrived with a full set of fire dogs, a large picture of a horse and a mysterious horse hoof.

Last week I inherited a 'Spirit Kettle'. It's electro-plated nickel silver – so not really worth anything at auction and was given by my Great Aunt Daisy to send my grandparents on picnics while camping. You put a burning oil in the bottom, water in the top and voila, you have some mildly warmed tea. It was never used but the real treasure was inside. A spidery and handwritten note seems to convey strange instructions or a message that is barely legible, I don't know what it says but I'm hoping for buried treasure...

What it really needs is a good clean but you can't put this sort of thing in the dishwasher. It needs carefully treating, scraping off crud and polishing up. Some bits of the note are lost, others we can get hold of. The accretions of time are hard to get rid of without damaging the fabric, even when they are undesirable.

Last week was St George's Day and last Thursday we celebrated our patron Saint with our fellow St Georges Roman Catholic Church. The truth is that finding out about THE St George is very difficult. The legends conflict and the information is scratchy at best. I'm pretty sure there wasn't a dragon but it's hard to get rid of the crud of history.

Perhaps we can't quite get all of the details right. Some things are lost to time. But others aren't. The festival of St George gives us a good excuse to connect with the other St Georges; we share a saint for we share our object of worship, for in the end there is only one church, and it is little bits of history that have once divided us.

We can't always agree about what the note says, or which way to clean the kettle up, but...we can gather in worship to the same God and Father of Jesus Christ and the same Holy Spirit. And then at the end, have a cup of tea – just not from the 'spirit kettle'.


JUST AN HOUR OR SO A MONTH CAN MAKE A LOT OF DIFFERENCE

one God, now and for ever.


