# Your Vicar

We ordered a bag of onions this week.

We don't eat onions for various nonpublishable reasons so they're surplus to requirements. The online delivery only sold them in bags not as an individual vegetable and the eldest needs them for his cooking class. So we've got eight onions and we need one. What are we going to do with them?

The short answer is that I don't know. It's a bit weird to give someone a bunch of onions, it feels wrong to put good food in the food waste. The truth is that one bag of onions cost 80p and whilst I don't want you thinking we're fat cats living in the vicarage, that ain't going to break the bank entirely.

No, I haven't completely run out of things to write about this is going somewhere.

Apart from the craziness of buying excess onions, last week we also visited Taunton's first community fridge in Monkton Heathfield, nestled next to the new primary school. It was fantastic.

Firstly, the simplicity of the idea. Excess food doesn't rot slowly at home but can be used by other people. Second, anyone can access it, no questions asked, just take what you need. But thirdly and my clear favourite was the wonderful spin offs that have been developed. People love it so much they're working on a community garden, a toddler group has been grown too (also called stay and play!), community baking groups....all in the space of a neat seven months.

New housing estates are often thought of as soulless and unfriendly blocks

of housing that are good for companies building them but less so for people to live in. But this was brilliant and made a centre for the people to gather.

A major part of the vision of this church is to be the 'beating heart of Wilton and Sherford' and the good news is that we've just received the grant to be Taunton's second community fridge. So no more will my excess onions slowly wilt in my fridge, no more will the glut of courgettes from the allotment keep you awake at night instead there will be a local place where the plenty can be shared and bounty distributed.

I often think about the people of Israel wandering in the desert. They collected manna from the ground and were invited to take enough for each day.

Everyone had enough and no one was hungry. But if you tried to hoard it, the manna would rot. We're gonna stop the rot and share the plenty...and save the onions!

This is a fairly big new project for us and if you want to be involved in cleaning/collecting/opening the fridge please be in touch. Full training will be provided and more detail to follow.

They provide aviation, communications and learning technology services to more than 1000 Christian and humanitarian agencies, as well as thousands of isolated missionaries and indigenous villagers in the world's most remote areas - often ferrying people in need of emergency medical help to a hospital or taking mission partners to work with the communities to which they have been sent.



MAF believe that every community, however remote, should have the essentials for life. Their vision is 'to see isolated people changed by the love of Christ'.
