How? I have no clue yet but copy writers are probably out of a job soon. This is basically a baby version that produced that wooden sounding article above and


yet it is not hard to imagine it improving and quickly. I recommend you play with it, whilst it's still free.

#### **OUR CHARITY COLLECTION IS FOR ST MARGARETS HOSPICE**

Our collections this week will be donated to St Margaret's Hospice, who have specialist In-patient beds at their Taunton Hospice, supporting patients with complex needs.

Their specialist team of doctors, nurses, therapists and volunteers provide individual palliative care and support in homely and comfortable surroundings. As well as treating each patient's symptoms and controlling pain, they care for the emotional, psychological and spiritual needs of each person with respect and sensitivity.

They aim to achieve symptom control to support discharge and help patients to return home. Working with Social Workers, Occupational Therapists and Community Teams means they can make sure this happens safely and successfully. They support carers and families, offering training where required, to ensure safe discharge. Patients may remain at the Hospice for end-of-life care if this is best for them.

St Margaret's Hospice Care is a charity - not part of the NHS
