A Note From YOUR VICAR

Last week we joined with St Georges Romans Catholic Church for our annual joint service. We take it in turns to host with visitors offering the preacher. This time it was Rob's turn to preach, he did a good job and nobody said a peep about a Cromwell preaching in a Roman Catholic Church....

There is so much in common between the Roman Catholic and Protestant Church; we worship the same Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we read from the same bible, we engage in regular worship, receive communion and meet in a castle (ahem). We are definitely drawn from the same tree and yet Anglicans emphasise different aspects of the church from their Roman heritage. This is fairly obvious in the way we conduct our normal Sunday worship from the different dress that clergy wear to the use of incense and who is involved in the service. St Georges Catholic Church is a stunning building with remarkable windows and enormous amount of light.

Yet the most wonderful surprise last Sunday was the double booking. The service started at 4.00. But at 3.50 the entire building was filled with members of the Kerala Community, a portion of Roman Catholicism that hails from South India. A Bishop specifically for that community from across the whole of Britain was visiting and welcoming younger people to their first communion and the families were dressed as though they were attending a wedding (which in Catholic Theology they kind of are... but that's another story). Those leading the ceremonies were dressed with incredible complexity, beautiful garments

and marvellous hats that have wondrous names that I do not know about. In my mind, I tend to think of Catholic rites as fairly structured and formal – this is generally true and yet what I hadn't appreciated was that understandings of structure and formality are diverse. In an English setting, formality generally means only one thing happens at a time in a sober tone – whereas last Sunday, events were treated with great earnest seriousness whilst multiple things happened simultaneously; a song was being sung, statutes being acknowledged, flowers being moved, people blessed at the front by the Bishop, kids were eating sweets that I think they were supposed to wait for...it was a little overwhelming and totally charming act of worship. The church was also full. Then at the end of our scheduled joint service, we had to scoot out because the Romanian language Mass was about to begin...

I actually find this quite exciting and enriching and a hopeful sign. I've been a Christian most of my life and the majority story in the West has been of the slow march of secularism that will destroy the church. But I believe in a God who resurrects people and a God who is constantly renewing his church. The average Anglican is now a woman under 30 living in Sub-Saharan Africa and I think what we might be seeing in our little town is the beginnings of a reversal, as those who once received missionaries now return and re-tell the gospel that much of the West has forgotten.
