tension within it. We respect those who work hard but look forward to a retirement of doing nothing; we love bank holidays but fill them with DIY.



GOOD FOOD FOR ALL What is a Community Fridge?

A community fridge is a space where anyone can exchange food that would otherwise go to waste. Run by local volunteers, many fridges also provide a positive social space for local visitors to learn more about food, sustainable eating, growing your own and eating on a budget.

The UK's first community fridge was trialled in 2016. Since then, 100s of community fridges have taken root across the UK

helping thousands connect to their neighbours, access nutritious food, save money and reduce waste.

Our Charity Collection for the remainder of the month is therefore for CHRISTIAN AID



Our collections until the end of May will support **'CHRISTIAN AID WEEK'** and will help farmers plant better seeds, secure a fairer price for their crops and build happier futures for their children.

Families in developing countries are paying, proportionately, a greater price in this global crisis. Food, fuel, fertilizer and school fees have doubled in price in the last 12 months in Malawi - for example - and hard-working farmers are seeing their harvests fail as the climate change crisis brings increasingly erratic weather, droughts and floods.

The impact of the recent 'Cyclone Freddy' in Malawi has been devastating. Floods have washed away crops, over 500,000 people have been displaced and hundreds have lost their lives. Christian Aid is working NOW to help families build back, and will continue to support the 'pigeon pea project' - which uses a specially-developed, hardy, drought-resistant crop which can be used to bake delicious bread for families and with which women, in particular, can begin small enterprises and make money to pay for medicines when needed, send their children to school and create a happier future for their children and grandchildren. £10 can secure a 2kg bag of 'pigeon pea' seeds.

Everything we can give this Christian Aid Week will help many to build a better and more secure future for their families.


