A Note From **YOUR**



You might notice that the tower is looking a little different from how it normally does....Don't worry the vicar hasn't gone (totally) bonkers or started the building project plans early.

One of the pinnacles had to be removed following a safety concern raised in an inspection report. If you've ever seen the movie Hot Fuzz, then you may recall a very graphic scene where one of those great stone pieces falls onto someone's head.... we did not want that to happen to anyone or indeed our roof to be damaged by falling debris.

The team that performed the removal were excellent. Knowledgeable, friendly and using lots of terms that I have never heard of. Merlins and merlinettes, finnials and versicles that I am not sure if they were making the terms up or if I've just made them up for your digestion. Here goes one of the conversations JPConstruction: 'There is a tree growing on your lower edge merlin, near the quadfoil'. Me Externally: 'Ah yes I see!; Me Internally: 'Look for a tree, look for a tree'

It's dangerous work up there but they brought a real joy and professionalism to their trade that it was enlivening to speak with them.

Part of our duty as a community is to maintain this building to be used and enjoyed by the next generation. It needs to be safe - safety isn't first (otherwise we'd do nothing) but it is basic.

That's right there in the bible – Deuteronomy 22.8 tells builders to build a 'parapet around your roof, so you don't incur blood guilt'! Health and safety 4000 vears ago!

So what's next? The current pinnacle is not repairable. A replacement would need to be commissioned and carved and then put in place. This will not be cheap. And so as a community one of the jobs is prioritization. Where do we use our resources and when? We have a big building project forthcoming; we would like to consider adding new staffing for children and families work; our car park will soon be reimagined as a tourist site for those who can't get to the grand canyon; seagulls use my roof as an annual retreat centre and bits of nearly all our buildings are falling off. So how to choose? We'll get quotations but some things just need to wait for the right moment - especially if they're decorative.

One small bit of beautiful wisdom that came out from our conversation was the need for step-by-step maintenance. Making an annual check part of our budget and story rather than massive one-off projects. If we can keep it ticking the building ticking over, we can keep her going well for the next generation.

1) We were delighted to welcome Keith Powell as our new Prayer Coordinator. Keith Powell spoke on the importance of prayer and the plans for the next stage of developing the prayer life of the church including new prayer groups and ministry from September.

- 2) Capacity questions. The PCC have been asked to consult with the congregations about shifting the times of both services to reduce friction of the handover. 

There are many examples in the bible of individuals, whole people groups who were displaced from their homes including Jesus himself. He fled to Egypt with his mother and father to escape the persecution of Herod. Today we face a major refugee crisis in our world and we believe that the church has a voice in such times. We have an opportunity to display our love for our world and its people in the action we take today. Our faith in Christ underpins everything we do.

TAUNTON WELCOMES REFUGEES

Taunton Welcomes Refugees (TWR) is a charity that is run by volunteers. They have come together to welcome the refugees that are living in Taunton, Wellington, Bridgwater and the surrounding area.



TWR works through its enthusiastic and resourceful volunteers to engage with refugees, both families and individuals, and finds ways to work with them to ease the transition from new arrivals to integrated members of our society. Their needs are, of course, as varied as the people themselves. But all need help with finding their way around the local area; sorting out minor problems with their allocated houses and learning English.

TWR also coordinates events where refugee families can meet each other and discuss common problems and their solutions. There are also opportunities for refugees to learn new skills that will be useful in our society such as cycling, gardening and catering regulations.
