A Note From YOUR CURATE



Dear friends,

As I write, it is St George's Day. 'That's strange', I hear you cry, 'I thought it was last week!' Well, in any other year you are right, but because of a strange quirk of the Church calendar, we don't commemorate Feast days in the week after Easter, so it was pushed back to 28th April this year.

St George was likely a Turkish, Roman soldier, born in the 3rd century AD. Although he is mostly remembered now for slaying dragons, his greatest legacy is that he stood up to the Roman Emperor Diocletian, who launched a brutal campaign of persecution against Christians. George, a Christian, refused to renounce his faith, or participate in the persecution, for which he was imprisoned, tortured, and eventually executed. His defiance wasn't military rebellion — it was moral resistance: standing firm against a regime demanding absolute loyalty.

In the UK, we are so fortunate to live in a society where Christians aren't persecuted. But, around the world, it seems as though societies are getting more divided, governments are getting more authoritarian, and countries are becoming more isolated from one another – choosing to compete against one another – even ally vs ally – rather than come together to face the issues together. The bible talks often about how God desires Christians to work together in unity, and Jesus goes as far as to say that we will know who his followers are, by how they love one another. We are called, like St George, to stand against leaders who aim to bring disharmony, and stoke fear of others, and instead show the love of God to anyone and everyone.

By the time you read this, we will have had our annual St George's day service with our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters. Both churches share the same name, St George's, and each year we come together to commemorate and celebrate his memory together. Although we worship in different styles, we have so much more in common than anything that divides us. We will worship and pray together, and afterwards share in some refreshments and enjoy spending time together, despite our different traditions.

As we go forward, may we continue to seek that unity in our daily lives across churches, across communities, even across differences — so that the love of Christ will be seen more clearly through us. St George stood firm before an emperor; we will stand together — in faith, in hope, and in love.

BUGGY BUDDIES


