A Note From

Your Vicar

At the beginning of the week we were awarded a grant from Taunton Town Council towards our community fridge project. I had to present to a whole council room and pushed a microphone to speak. It felt like the UN or something you see on TV. There were 16 applicants and to make sure that everyone kept to their allotted time there was a buzzer. It was nicknamed 'the buzzer of doom'. At the end of my presentation, I said, 'I'll finish there so I don't get the buzzer of doom. 'I wouldn't dare', joked the chair, 'I might get struck down by lightening'...

At the end of our 9.30 services I stand at the door and greet everyone as they depart. One of our most committed regulars often says to me; 'The sun shines on the righteous'.

There is a temptation to think that clergy are a different breed. We wear funny collars and wear funny clothes. In the church building there are areas that vicars stand in but not everyone else. Even the cheekiest of Scouts will ask me quietly - am I allowed up there...?

But there is a danger in all of this 'vicars are a different breed' business. The end of the phrase 'the sun shines on the righteous and on the unrighteous alike' means that however righteous/ unrighteous we think we are, then 'stuff' happens to all of us. Today was one of

those days. Pushed from pillar to post in the day, I cycled to retrieve the car, carried 5 litres of petrol in a backpack to retrieve the car from the garage which gave me a £300 bill. As I tried to refill my tank with a jerry can, petrol poured onto my shoes. I called my daughter to pick her up from school, I put my phone on speaker resting it on the top of the car. Halfway to school, I realised my phone was missing and found it smashed on the forecourt of the garage.

Sun shines and the rain falls on all alike.

Being a Christian isn't pretending everything is peachy, it's knowing that in the mess, that I'm not alone and that my job here as the vicar is not to be overwhelmed by all the mess but work through it and in it, to the glory of the one who in the end, makes all things well.

CARMEN CROMWEL

We've been so blessed already by the arrival of the Cromwell family and are super excited to see what God will do through Rob, Carmen and the kids.

This summer, Carmen was selected for ordination at a Bishops Selection Conference to be a 'Distinctive Deacon' and we look forward to her ordination in June 2025. To prepare for ordination she will begin her training at Trinity College Bristol on a part time basis, to 'top up' the completion of her recent theology degree.

The way that the Church of England understands 'Deacons' is that they are focused more clearly on the world and community beyond the boundaries of the church than within it. They are allowed to lead, preach, to baptise and marry people, but not to lead communion services. In the CofE it's possible to be ordained three times - as a Deacon, Priest and Bishop and the different ordinations build upon one another. So, Rob is now ordained as a Deacon but expects to be ordained as a Priest next year. Carmen feels a distinctive call to Mission and outreach particularly amongst younger people and so will remain as a Deacon through her ministry life. If this is confusing, then do ask questions! This means that Carmen is now an 'ordinand' and will be a placement student here with us (woohoo!). This role will evolve over time, but she will be involved in services and youth work. Alongside this, Carmen is running a charity, 'Pulse', which seeks to train, equip and support churches to deliver children and vouth work.
