St GEORGE'S

On Monday I thought I had an evening off. Richard was leading the Ministry Experience Scheme and so I was back home for 7.30.

In lots of ways that is a healthy dose of reality, but it does mean that we can underestimate our ability to make good things happen or to be a block on wonderful things from working. To stretch an analogy, will we be a mustard seed or a pumpkin seed?


WOMENS CHRISTMAS GATHERING


In this run-up to Christmas they are encouraging the world to "shine a light for peace" and ask us "this Christmas, how will you shine a light for peace?"


