Your Vicar

This weekend marks the Coronation of King Charles III and for all of the ceremony, long speeches and the grandeur of the occasion, I am struck by what it must be like for him, the King.

For he is just a man. He eats and drinks and sleeps. He probably stubs his toe sometimes and if he steps on Lego it hurts – though he can probably blame some courtier rather than a child. Sometimes the simplest things strike me as so strange. When you look through your own eyes, you can see yourself in the mirror only; you can see others without concentrating. And others when they look at you, have it reversed. And so for all of the walls of sound, the gold, the Bishops with improbable hats, one man sees all this through his own eyes and sits upon the throne. How must that feel? I have no idea but as he phrases it, 'it is a strange thing to get used to when you are an object of interest'. How does it feel to see your own face on actual money?

In the bible, only three groups of people are anointed; prophets, priests and kings. Our King Charles will be anointed by a Christian Archbishop in a Christian Abbey in a tradition that stretches back all the way to the Kings of Saul, David and Solomon. Oil poured onto the head to set one apart for a different task and role. Pray that he will hold this mantle well. The anointing with oil is one sign on top of a

lot of others signs including sceptres, crowns and orbs. None of these signs make him King – they symbolise his present identity and tell him and us who he is.

On a day-to-day basis we don't tend to think about signs and symbology but if you pause even for a moment, you'll find your life is filled with them. On a birthday, people sing that song and give you a cake with candles on it to remind you're that bit older, if you're married you'll probably wear a ring and if you're middle aged then you can signify your identity crisis with a red sports car. Signs tell us who we are and who the people around us are too. The coronation tells us that something has shifted in the national character and mood and we're looking at a new beginning. That's not optional, the coronation is a sign of a new dawn that is breaking upon us. Pray that it might be a good one.

The Coronation will be a historic moment in the life of our nation, a time to reflect on our history, celebrate who we are and look to our future.

At its centre is a Christian service in which His Majesty will be anointed as King. It will be rooted in longstanding tradition and Christian symbolism. We offer our prayers for King Charles III and the Royal Family for this important occasion.

The Church of England has said that they hope this might be a moment for the nation and many around the world to encounter the person of Jesus Christ, the servant King, and hear His call to each of us to serve others.

The Liturgy for the Coronation will be a Christian act of worship that honours the ancient tradition of anointing and crowning Monarchs. It will also reflect the Monarch's role, while celebrating the character of Britain as it is today and looking forward to the future with hope.

By longstanding tradition, the Archbishop of Canterbury authorises a new Liturgy for every Coronation. Commissioned by the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Justin Welby, the new Liturgy is based on ancient texts and ceremonial elements that draw on many centuries of tradition. The Liturgy is focussed on the theme of loving service to others, which is central to Christian teaching, and to the character of contemporary Monarchy.

The Liturgy is accompanied by a Commentary commissioned by the Archbishop, which explains the Christian meaning and symbolism of the key elements of the service.


Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him;


STROLLS FOR THE SOUL
