## A Note From Your Vicar

Last Saturday I tore down a shed. Well. I say a Shed. It's a 'Summer House' if you are so inclined. A friend of a friend of a friend's house is being demolished and this mature gentleman would have had to pay someone else to take it down and he wanted to give it away.

So instead, my Son and I bought a 'utility bar' or two and travelled to take this thing apart ready to be reinstalled in the Vicarage garden. I brought all of the tools in my potted tool boxes I could possibly carry, hammers, lump hammers, drills, saws, bolsters, grips and bits I couldn't be bothered to scoop out of the bottom plus a decent step ladder.

On arrival, the 'Summer House' (if you emphasise the 'M' it sounds posher) is in a slightly better and slightly worse condition than I remembered. The decking at the front was rotten to the core and a single foot would quickly descend to the green earth below. This did not inspire confidence. Nevertheless, taking up the carpet, the actual posh-shed seemed fine but the surrounding bits were grim....

Then I realised...I actually don't know where to start. The roof seemed the obvious place but there were no clear joins. There was some old guttering which I figured needed taking off....that removed...I needed to climb on top of the roof. This was a moment...I had just seen a grown man's foot crash through a rotten piece of wood, I did not know whether I would come down through the very same structure. My help was my teenage son and a man I barely knew who was aged 'north of 80ish'. I climbed up thinking, if I die, my curate is away and I don't know who would take the service...

I did it anyway.

Would it have passed a risk assessment? No. Would I encourage others under my care to do it? No. But I wanted to get this thing out of the way for the man and I wanted to take it home for my family. Sometimes you've got to risk it. Modern life it seems to me is the removal of all potential risks. But I've been thinking about this line from Ecclesiastes 12.

'When men are afraid of heights and dangers in the streets when the almond tree blossoms and the grasshoppers drag their legs and desire is no longer stirred. Then man goes to his eternal home and mourners go about in the streets.'

It is a strange passage. What I think it means is: live. Do not be afraid but live. Do stuff. Love God, build things, learn things, love your neighbour and live.

The house was fine, I was fine and maybe in the summer you can come over and have a cup of tea in the new summer house.

There are exciting times ahead! God Bless

## CHARITY COLLECTION OPEN DOOR ROOF APPEAL

The Open Door day centre for Taunton's homeless community is housed in a grade 2 listed building that dates back to the 1880s, and the Charity is responsible for the good repair of the building.

A recent building survey has revealed that they need to make major repairs to the roof of the building and need to raise £50,000 to complete the major structural work including structural timbers, chimney repairs and replacement roof membrane.

By the end of November, the total raised for this important campaign has reached £10,000.


