The Vision

The vision at St George's Church, Wilton is to grow in spirit and to grow in number. God is calling us on an adventure of faith to love him more deeply and to overflow with love for our neighbours in this community. Our tiny corner of Somerset is growing rapidly, attracting new people week by week thrilled with the heart for the gospel of Jesus spreading across the town. Over the next 12 months. God is stirring up new plans, gospel projects and abundant life here.

The Background

The Christian story is one of lavish grace. Even when humans were most opposed to God's plans, he poured himself out, so that anyone can receive the invitation into God's people. So, worship and ministry will always be free to access. There are no paywalls, entry tickets or subscription levels to be passed. Hallelujah! Yet, since the ministry of Jesus there has always been a cost to providing this ministry. In the gospels, we read of how the work of Jesus and the disciples were supported by three women, Mary, Joanna and Susannah who 'provided for them out of their means'. In order to grow in spirit and number, in order to be a blessing to this community, St George's relies on the support of people that 'provide from their own means'. God gives graciously and calls his people to give sacrificially. Thank you to everyone who supports the ministry.

The Cost

Where does the money all go? As part of the Church of England, St George's contributes to the common fund of the Diocese of Bath and Wells. The common fund pays for the vicar, housing, pension, all of the structures of the diocese including safeguarding, human resources, training new vicars plus the leadership including Bishops and Archdeacons. By having a common fund, the Church of England is able to offer ministry in places that otherwise would not be able to afford it. This means the gospel is preached throughout the county in rich and poor places!

To try and even out the costs across the whole of Somerset, each parish is asked for a 'parish share' which is calculated on the size of the congregation and the type of area you live in. For the parish of Wilton and Sherford, we are asked to contribute **£83,767** per year (that is **£1,610** per week). St George's has a fantastic record of paying it's share but the financial challenges of Covid have meant we've struggled to meet these costs for the last two years. Our local costs for the ministry at St Georges are the ongoing maintenance of our buildings, our *fantastic* parish administrator,

office costs, churchyard maintenance and contribution to chaplaincy at Bishop Henderson School. In total, these normally cost over **£70,000** per year.

Broken down on a weekly basis, St George's needs to raise around **£3000** per week to maintain our ministry. For members of St Georges, these bills are our collective responsibility to manage. Thank you to everyone who cheerfully contributes time, effort and money.

To be a Blessing

The Christian life is not a to-do list of obligations; Jesus calls his people to an abundant life and to share that abundant life with our neighbours. Consequently, we don't just want to 'fulfil our obligations' but to be a blessing. In this coming year, we hope to begin new work, supporting the vulnerable, lonely and sick, to engage the young, facilitate deeper life of prayer and worship and begin re-shaping some of our spaces to make welcome even more people to God's praise.

In just one year, St Georges has grown wonderfully! What will God do amongst us next? We need your support to facilitate this blessing to God's people. So here are some simple steps:

Prav:

- Begin with thanking God for all the gifts you've received.
- How might God want to use those gifts?
- Decide how much of your income you want to give back to God's work. The historic pattern of tithing suggested 10%, use this as a auide.
