A Note From YOUR VICAR



Picture the scene. The car is packed, the other vehicles are all in a row, ready to exit the ferry. You get in. The key turns; the engine does not turn and the car wont start to get you off the ferry. Sleepaddled crazy thoughts rush through vour mind - will we live on the ferry now? Do the AA come onto ferries? Those people behind us are looking very cross and I hope they don't punch me. But, none of those things happen because this is normal life and not a film. Instead, I waved for help and a friendly French ferry worker came across to get us started. He used one of these clever battery packs. We tried connecting all of the wires. Three times. Nothing worked. More staff gathered around and I was, dear reader, increasingly nervous. A transit van roared up towards us: hooked up and then revved her engine aggressively. One, two three....the car started!

The shout of joy! What a relief that my children don't have to finish their education on Brittany Ferries or watch those cross journey 'entertainments' again. We were free and homeward bound.

I'm your Vicar. Did I pray? Yes I did. In fact I learnt about myself that I do actually practice what I preach; if I'm nervous or concerned, prayer is my first resort. But prayer is not magic and frankly the battery was clearly broken and needed fixing. So, we tried to nurse it all the way

home from New Haven to Taunton to get the attention we needed. But at a pit stop, I tiredly turned the engine off and it would not start again.

This time there were no friendly French ferry men who were particularly keen to get me off their boat and I had to ask for help from strangers. Initially, the young couple I asked said no; then when I was polite and thanked them anyway, they consented. It didn't work (that's a story for another time) but they helped. It feels very vulnerable to need help and this is not a pleasant feeling. But sometimes we are vulnerable and there is nothing else you can do. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, a man is robbed and left for dead. He is helped and restored to health. Normally the preacher says, 'now when you see those who need help, offer it'. But what if you're not the good Samaritan? What if you're the person on the road? How does that feel? How do you feel when you need support? In the good news of Christianity is that we are sinners and that help – freely given - is available. God sees that we need help and in Jesus really does something about it. But our side is that we do need to actually receive the support that is given and that – strangely – can be one of the hardest parts.

The Alpha course has just started but there's always room for one more if you want to explore these things further.

THIS COMING SUNDAY

The Eleven service is back on this week. This is an unexpected change and I'm sorry for the short notice of it. We had cancelled our service in order to make space for people to attend the joint B1 service at Wellsprings. However, the last week I have had a number of voices raising concerns about the speaker for the event, Dr Joseph Boot.

Dr Boot brings a more combative form of Christian dialogue than is common in the UK context. This is his preference and style. Yet his public comments in the last few days have given me pause to the extent that I could no longer commend our church to go and listen to his teaching. We live in febrile and sensitive times when the whirling temptations to be drawn into negative rhetoric about those who are different from ourselves can be difficult to resist and I do not want to assent to this practice by attending and sending our church en masse. To love thy neighbour; to love thy enemy is not weakness or woke, it is Christian. It is the pattern of Christ himself.

I need to be very clear that St Georges remains committed to ongoing fellowship with other churches across the town from B1 and beyond. I believe in the freedom of speech and conscience; you are very welcome to attend the service at Wellsprings with the

other churches and I would like to hear your opinions but I will not attend.

Pray for all the churches across the town, for their unity, integrity and fidelity to the good news of Jesus Christ.





"We are part of a national team first pioneered in 2003, and Street Pastors continues to grow throughout the UK and across the world.

Street pastors are trained volunteers from local churches and we care about our community.

We are usually on patrol from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. on a Friday or Saturday night to care for, listen to and help people who are out on the streets.

We are led by our local coordinator and we also have support from local churches and community groups in partnership with the police, local council and other statutory agencies.
