A Note From **Your Vicar**

Are you feeling 'Christmassy' yet?

I don't really know what this means.

I think that's partly because the idea is vaque. It can mean 'ready for Christmas' or it can mean 'I've had a lovely experience which felt quintessentially Christmas like', but what qualifies for this 'Christmas feeling' varies enormously but it's often whether a massive and ever growing list of 'traditions' for Christmas is completed. The details will vary but Christmas is a time which is laden with meaning and tradition that could probably do with some spreading out across the year. There is special food which we love/endure: hot wine (love), sprouts (love), pigs in blankets (love - actually I don't think I dislike any Christmas food). There is special music which is played on a loop in every store and carol service. Some have more active traditions, massive hikes or cold water swimming. Other traditions are changing, so Christmas Cards are reducing year on year (it's not just me...). Then there is church too which has it's own set of traditions which as your Vicar makes me a bit nervous because I feel like I'm supposed to know them telepathically and am in constant danger of tripping over some hallowed tradition that I didn't know about...

These traditions build upon one another until they can become a bit stressful. I'm sure one Christmas I tried three different supermarkets in search of cranberry sauce (a 'meh' for me) and going around the post-apocalyptic looking supermarkets I saw a sort of wild hollo-eyed fear amongst shoppers...what if....they've run out of stuffing mix, chocolate coins or...

The majority of the traditions started with an awesome sign. Nicholas of Myra gives coins to poor children at Christmas, the tree has been used as an image of the Trinity, Christmas lights indicate the light of Jesus coming into the world. I love it and say cheers to the celebration - light in the darkness is important. But I wonder that as these signs and traditions build up, we stop seeing what they point to and only see the signs themselves. So it's ok not to try and achieve a 'perfect Christmas' – signs are useful when they point to something else but not when they point to themselves. If there is no cranberry sauce/sprouts/ but you spend time with your loved ones, in prayer or service to others that is more 'Christmassy'. And unlike the stressful and consumer driven visions we see everywhere, these are acts achievable and life giving.

BISHOPS CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

Bishop Michael

Recently I enjoyed a visit to Bath Abbey, where they were busy getting ready for a charity Carol service and just outside their doors there was the hustle and bustle of Bath with the Christmas market in full flow. People were buying presents. Traders were promoting their wares. Mulled wine, mince pies and a host of different treats were being enjoyed.

At Christmas, how does all that's happening in places like the Christmas market relate to what's going on in church? In the market and in the shops, it's mainly about buying and selling, commerce in full flow. Whereas in the Abbey and in all our churches, the focus is on recalling the journey of Mary and Joseph, the birth in the stable, the arrival of the shepherds, the song of the angels, the visit of the Magi.

How can there be any connection between what looks like two very different worlds? Quite simply, the connection is Jesus. In him, God came to be at one with us. To share fully in every aspect of our humanity, from our physical needs to our enjoyment of the world that God has given us, to our spirituality, that hunger for the divine that's at the heart of every human soul. When Jesus was born in that stable 2000 years ago, he came to join in every part of our human condition – from market, to church, to every place in which we find ourselves.

And as we look at the world around us at the close of this year, it's important to remember that Jesus came to be with us not just for the good times, but for the difficult too. Jesus is 'God with us' everywhere— in trenches in Ukraine, bomb shelters in Israel and Gaza, in hospital wards where loved ones die, in relationships where there is conflict and distress.

The baby born in Bethlehem stands with us in all that we experience. This child comes too to offer us the possibility of opening every part of our lives to the transforming power of God's life of love and joy and peace. He comes so that every day we can become whole, a little more like him – growing into his likeness in every place in which we find ourselves – from our churches to our marketplaces, our homes to the whole of the world in which we live.

May the love, joy and peace of Jesus, the God who is with us, be yours this Christmas and always.
