A Note From

Your Vicar

Growing in Spirit and Growing in number. This is the vision of St Georges Church. And it's actually happening.

On a virtually weekly basis, new people are asking me how they can go deeper in their walk of faith and more people are joining this community. It is a fantastic time and I'm loving it. You know it's alright when people say to me on a weekly basis – what are you going to do? You're outgrowing your spaces – people can't get a seat. Short term...

I don't know. Long term....well there are some plans afoot.

Our wonderful PCC member and retired architect, Paul Cole has helped us to think carefully about all of our spaces at St Georges, the office/vicarage, church and hall and this Sunday, he'll bring some of those ideas to the wider congregation. The PCC and staff team have already been thinking about them for a while and now it's time to make a start.

The first phase is to try and get the office space sorted out. At the moment, the entrance to the office is shared with the vicarage accessed via steps. The stairs are too shallow with a nasty catch at the top. For users of anything with wheels they are totally inaccessible; for users who are a little less steady on their feet I anxiously watch ankles wobble on a daily basis on those stairs. We've had one accident in my time, where a trip led to a gash so severe that it took two weeks to heal. I do not want to mop blood out of shoes again in the office.

The current arrangement is also awkward for office users accessing the vicarage front door and there are many stories of volunteers trying to creep in the front door to avoid disturbing the family and more loudly, the dogs!

The proposal is to make a new separate entrance to the church office using the window adjacent to

the road with improved steps into the office and vicarage. The current space is already divided into two; this will make a type of reception area and an office for our staff to work in. Alongside Bethan and Chris, we'll have our curate, Rob starting in July and separating these spaces will make a professional and usable space for a growing staff team to work in.

Ever since the profile was written for my role as vicar, the vision for St Georges was to become the community hub, the 'beating heart of Sherford and Wilton'. To make this a reality, we need some financial help. The projected quotations for phase 1 are around £25,000 and that's not money most of us find down the back of the sofa, so we need help. This first phase is really to help our ministry flow out and keep the increasing lines of communication going. Plans are being worked up to improve the hall and church to accommodate our growing numbers and vision for the future. But that's tomorrow's problem and today has enough worries of it's own. Now is the first step towards helping us grow in spirit and number.

We'd be hugely grateful if you could prayerfully consider how you might be able to contribute financially towards this challenging target which will enable us to deliver phase 1 of our ambitious plans. St George's congregation has a history of generosity and we're confident that God will provide through His people again.

Just a reminder following on from last week's article that Churchyard Gardening is starting up again **THIS SATURDAY.**




Being on our teams is fun and fulfilling and is not forever just for now

CHARITY COLLECTION at St G's

Our Charity Collection is for TAUNTON TEAM CHAPLAINCY

The purpose of the Taunton Team Chaplaincy is to advance the Christian faith in the town by providing care, witness and prayer in a wide range of community and workplace locations.

Chaplains are drawn from local churches and linked with a workplace or area to visit (usually weekly) with the purpose of offering friendly and supportive care to all. A chaplain's main aim is to listen and take an interest in the people they meet and give comfort and compassion where needed. Time spent with each person varies which may be enough to catch up but, if a longer conversation is needed, arrangements can be made for a chat at a convenient time.

While the Chaplaincy is unashamedly Christian, there is no intention to 'preach' and support is offered to all, those of faith or none. This is an opportunity for us to join with and support the work of the Taunton Team Chaplaincy and help to enable them to continue to show and share the love of God in our town.

- If after praying about it, you would like to change the amount you are already giving to St George's, you will need to fill out a new pledgeform and, if appropriate a new standing order form.


- If you are putting your affairs in order and are considering making a will or revising an existing one, would you like to remember St George's in your will? It can make a huge difference to us.

Romans 5:1-11 John 4:5-42


The Collect Sun 12th March Third Sunday of Lent


