A Note From **Your Vicar**

You can blame Adrian Youings for my presence here at St Georges. I was part of a local church that tended to be a bit suspicious of these Anglicans in all their robes and castles and so I was a bit nervous too. Mrs Griffin was much less concerned and told of this decent vicar in Trull who loved God and taught the bible clearly. He was a proper Christian and passed all of my teenage judgemental tests. Adrian was at Trull for 14 years and transformed the place leaving behind a vibrant community and envy-making facilities.

How did he do this? First, Adrian is a fantastic preacher. He had this way of sticking fast to a bible passage but somehow illuminating it in ways that I'd never imagined. He would tell stories that I remember to this day and people that started with a fairly nominal style faith found themselves drawn deeper and deeper into God. Secondly, he was a strategist, bringing on a team to grow and look after a community that was varied and fulsome. Somehow he managed to persuade local residents that the new community centre would benefit them more than the pain of reducing their view, parking and house prices. But mostly, he grew the church by loving the people that were in it. As a young minister, he gave me time, energy and care and helped me to see that the Church of England was not at all perfect (beware the church that pretends it is!) but it certainly was a distinctively Christian place where you could be a faithful minister of Jesus.

Part of this was his raw honesty about his own struggles which was such a far cry from the vicars that I had always imagined.

In 2017, he was whisked away to Bath to be their Archdeacon. This is not an easy job. You get all of the worst bits of the Church - the disputes about buildings, grumpy-vicars and bad behaviour but none of the nice bits of the parish (the people) or the palace and trappings of a Bishop. Funny old job and one which doesn't get a lot of love from the parishes. You can make a difference though in positions of power and all of the clergy I speak to in Bath speak warmly about his ministry to them. On Monday I got an email announcing that Adrian is leaving his role to begin a new ministry for Care for the Family which is based outside of the Diocese. Although he's not going far staying in Bath - I'm going to miss my old friend who I would sometimes bump into at Diocesan events and services.

They say don't meet your heroes but it seems to me that some people you meet are heroes; you just don't know yet. Adrian was one of those and his combination of faithfulness to God, loving care for the whole community and honesty is a role model for me as a vicar and us as a community.

Pray. It's what Christians do isn't it?



THE RETURN OF CHURCHYARD GARDENING

A VERY BIG THANK YOU to all who helped with churchyard gardening last year, whether at the Saturday sessions (3rd Saturday morning of the month, March – November), or by caring for an area of the churchyard in your own spare time, as part of St George's ADOPT-A-PLOT scheme.

In case anyone is wondering what goes on at the Saturday sessions: on average between 6 or 7 come along to help. It's rewarding to see the fruits of our labours, for example, freshly raked-up grass cuttings or leaves, a pruned bush, a cleared path, swept driveway, a weeded or planted border, or a wall cleared of ivy. It's a peaceful place to work, but there's also good company between times – it's encouraging to work together over a task, or to chat generally when we break to gather at about 11am round one of the benches for a 'Bring &

Share' drink and snack. If we're working at the front of the church, many people walk through the churchyard on their way to or from town, and they nearly always greet us or return our greeting or stop and talk for a few minutes. At other times people may come to visit the grave of family or friends, and it can be very uplifting for them to know that the churchyard is valued and cared for by us; and if we have spoken with them, it can help us to feel familiar with the names on grave stones of people we haven't personally known, or whose relatives we haven't met before.

The sessions are between 9.30 – 12.30, but sometimes people come for just an hour. That's absolutely fine of course; although they might then miss the tea break!

If you feel you would like to come along and help this year, please do; or come and have a word if you'd like to know more about caring for a specific small area of the churchyard in your own spare time.

And THANK YOU AGAIN to all of you who do already help.


